TROMBONE CLEANING

Supplies needed: snake, mouthpiece brush, slide grease, slide oil, dishwashing detergent, soft cloth, Pledge furniture polish.

Daily

- 1. Empty all water through the water key.
- 2. Using a soft cloth (cotton or flannel) wipe off all fingerprints.

Weekly

- 1. Clean the mouthpiece using lukewarm water and a mild, non abrasive soap (dishwashing detergent is good (toothpaste is actually good for silver mouthpieces).
- 2. Apply a few drops of slide oil to the "stock" (thicker part) of the slide.
- 3. Spray pledge furniture polish on a soft cloth and wipe off instrument.
- 4. Clean the case. (Vacuum the case).

Monthly

1. Clean the instrument.

Yearly

- 1. Inspect water key corks (ask director to assist you).
- 2. If you have a maintenance agreement with a music store it is a good idea to send you instrument to have it professionally cleaned and inspected during the summer.

CLEANING THE TROMBONE

- 1. Remove all slides and place them in tub of lukewarm (**NOT HOT**) soapy water. (Use dishwashing detergent.)
- 2. Place the rest of the instrument in the tub of water and let them soak for 15 minutes
- 3. Use the cleaning snake to clean out all the slides and tubes. Run the snake through the instrument several times.
- 4. Clean the mouthpiece using the mouthpiece brush.
- 5. Drain the tub and rinse the instrument in **COLD** water.
- 6. Dry of the instrument with a very soft cloth (cotton or flannel).
- 7. Grease the tuning slide and **carefully** replace it. (If you have trouble, take it to your director).
- 8. Oil the hand slide and put it back together.
